# 1 Before you start

If you're new to the PocketMac brand and line of products, welcome. If you've used previous PocketMac titles, there are a few things that are different about this product.

PocketMac® Safari Scrapbook is the first-ever automated Safari history scrapbook. This new tool continually archives the actual content behind where you've been on the Internet so you can easily pull it up a week, a month, a year or several years from now. The only thing you need is a keyword that you remember from your web travels and PocketMac Safari Scrapbook will find the page you're looking for.

With PocketMac Safari Scrapbook, there's no need to configure anything in your Mac's system preferences. Also, you do not have to configure Safari or change its preferences in any way.

This manual is designed to offer a tour of the new system, from the installation to settings and everything else in-between. Let's get started...

## 1.1 Basic System Requirements

Please ensure that your system meets these basic requirements before using PocketMac Safari Scrapbook. This can help to save time-consuming support incidents and make the overall experience much smoother.

For your Mac, please be sure that you are running Mac OS X 10.3 or newer.

Please also be sure that you are running Safari 1.2.4 or newer.

## 1.2 Install/Uninstall

Once you accept the license agreement, the Safari Scrapbook installation screen appears. This screen lets you select the location on your Mac in which the Safari Scrapbook software is installed. The default location is the "Applications" folder on your main hard drive. We recommend that all users install Safari Scrapbook to this location; only advanced users should select a different location.




At the top left of the Safari Scrapbook installation screen, the "Install" option is selected by default. To start the installation, click on the "Install" button on the lower right side of the installation screen. When the installation is complete, you will be prompted to restart your Mac.

If you should later decide to *uninstall* Safari Scrapbook, double-click on the installer's icon. You will be prompted for your Mac system password; enter it. When the Safari Scrapbook installation screen appears, select "Uninstall" from the dropdown menu box in the upper left side of the Safari Scrapbook installation screen. Next, click "Uninstall" from the lower right side of the Safari Scrapbook installation screen. When install has concluded, select "Quit" from the lower right side of the screen.

## 2 Launching Safari Scrapbook for the First Time

When Safari Scrapbook is launched for the first time, it will ask for the registration information by displaying the "Register Software" screen, as shown here.

You can register the software by entering your name, email address, and the serial number you received as part of the purchase process. (Please note that serial numbers are case-sensitive. This means that "xyz" is not the same as "XYZ" nor "xYz", etc.)



The Register Software window will connect to the internet and "activate" the software for this Macintosh. Each serial number can be activated on a maximum of two Macintoshes.

Safari Scrapbook will automatically quit if the Register Software window is unable to activate the software. If you would like to launch it manually, you can do so from the "Applications" folder.

When you're done entering your registration information, click the Register button to activate the software.

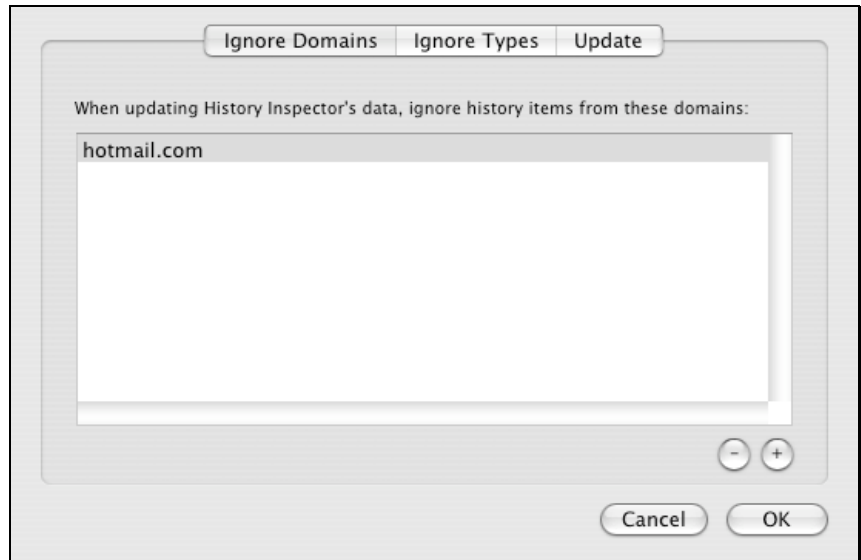
## 2.2 Configuring your Safari Scrapbook Preferences

As you can see, there are 3 sections to the preferences for Safari Scrapbook:

- Ignore Domains
- Ignore Types
- Update

### 2.2.1 Ignore Domains

This preference allows you to tell Safari Scrapbook to ignore certain websites when indexing your history items. For example, you might not want to archive items from pages you've visited at Hotmail.com or from a site you don't want staying in your history database. You can use this preference to enter those domains which you would like Safari Scrapbook to ignore when updating its data.



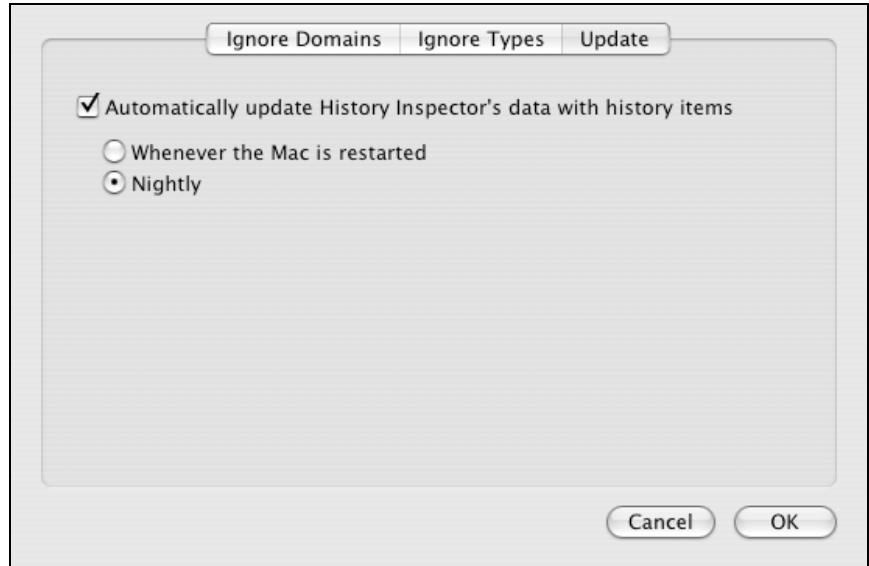
### 2.2.2 Ignore Types

This preference functions much like the Ignore Domains option, in that you can use it to tell Safari Scrapbook to ignore webpages of a certain file type. For example, you might not want to archive .php or .cgi pages. You can simply enter those file types you do not want to archive and they will be ignored.

### 2.2.3 Update

This preference tells Safari Scrapbook when to update its data from Safari's own history list.

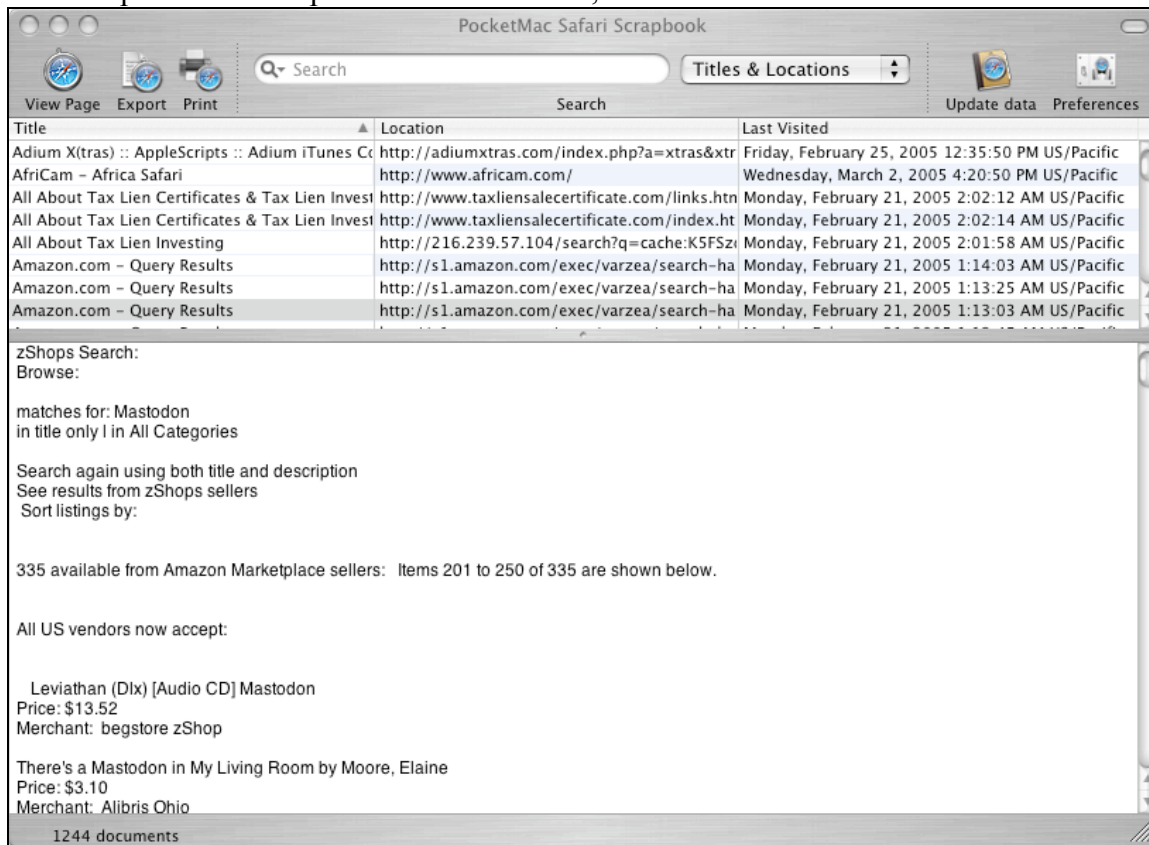
If you keep your Mac on most of the time, the Nightly option is probably the better choice; if you turn your Mac off at night, the restart option might be a better choice.



## 3 Using Safari Scrapbook

### 3.1 Toolbar

In order to explore the various features of Safari Scrapbook, let's take a look at the full set of toolbar options at the top of the main window, as shown here...





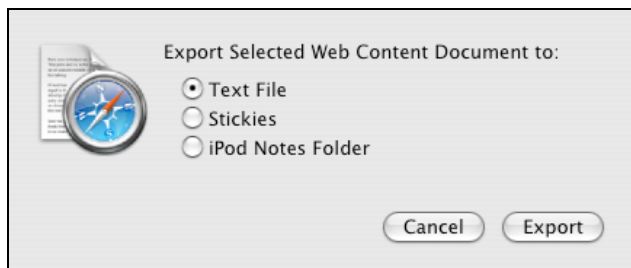
### 3.1.1 View Page

This toolbar button launches Safari, telling it to open the currently selected page.



### 3.1.2 Export

This toolbar button exports the currently selected page's contents to a variety of different formats/applications, as shown here...



### 3.1.3 Print

This toolbar button prints the currently selected page.



### 3.1.4 Search

This toolbar item is used to search for specific items in Safari Scrapbook. As you type in the search box, the list of matching pages below will automatically update itself to show those items matching the criteria you've entered. Please note that you can search both Titles as well as the full content of the saved history items.



### 3.1.5 Update Data

This toolbar button manually launches the update process; in which the data from Safari's own history items is added to the Safari Scrapbook database. This is something you'll need to do from time to time if you are not using the automatic update options in the preferences.



### 3.1.6 Preferences

This toolbar button displays the preferences for Safari Scrapbook.
